There are many Chicagoans who refer to Holy Family, (being our 160th anniversary) , as part of the early church. While I was away, I had time to see many churches in Antwerp, Belgium and Cologne, Germany. If we think our church is old, many of the cathedrals were built in the 1500's. It would seem like we have been waiting for a long time for the Second Coming of Christ...feels like forever. Since we know not the "day or the hour", as Jesus said, many of the early churches felt this way.

In the second reading, we hear that the Thessalonians had some difficulty with this. Many were expecting an immediate return of Christ, and when some of their members began to die before the Second Coming, they were disillusioned. In our readings Paul deals with the delayed Coming of Christ, by strengthening their hope, and challenging them to let go of their idea of when that would happen. So when will Christ come again? Many through the ages have tried to answer that question. In doing this we/they ignore the words of Christ himself, "no one knows". Take heed again in St. Paul's words today, and know we have been called to service in God in the meantime.

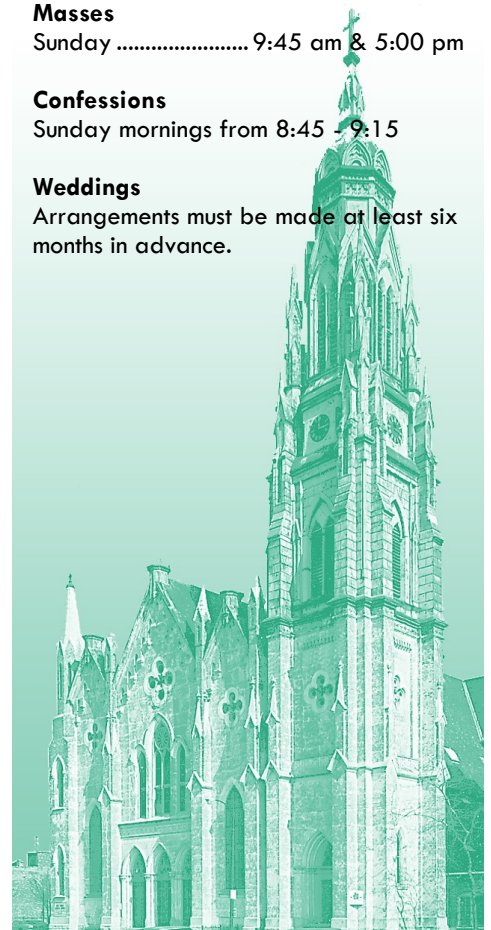

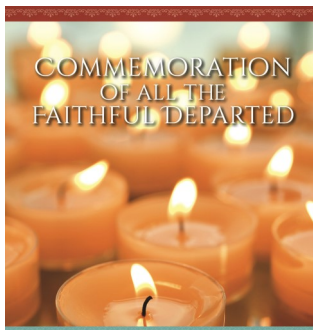

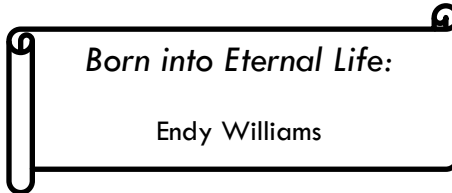
