Dear Friends,

The Church teaches us: "The sacraments of Christian initiation - Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist - lay the foundations of every Christian life. That we are born anew by Baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation, and receive in the Eucharist the food of eternal life."



Today we joyfully celebrate the First Communion of 23 young women and men. Our communicants are all dressed up in their finery for this joyous event. First Communion is indeed a cause for celebration and should be memorable as a holy and special day of being welcomed to the table of the Lord. It really can be a challenge to keep focused on the meaning of First Communion, with all the trappings of clothing and parties. I once heard a speaker say, if a child's First Communion is their best Communion, then we have failed. It may a child's first communion, but don't forget they will be receiving the

sacrament every time they gather at the table of the Lord. I think back to an analogy of growing up, when there was the kid's table and the big peoples table during the holidays. When we finally got to move up to the big table, we didn't get dressed up and no fuss was made of it. All of us I hope remember that each time we receive the sacrament of Eucharist it is significant. Parents, I pray that you bring your children often to the table, to experience the sacrifice and love of God in their reception of the Body and Blood of Christ. Nothing could top that.

Next Sunday, we will have our parish May Crowning. During the month of May, we honor the Virgin Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth. We will begin next Sunday's mass with a procession of our First Communicants and the women of the parish to our Blessed Virgin Mary altar, where we will present flowers and place a crown on our Mary statue. ( Feel free to bring flowers, plants etc to honor our Blessed Mother).

Also next Sunday, there will be a collection for Catholic Charities. This organization brings Christ's love and mercy to those who need it most, by assisting with food, finding housing, and job placement. Our support will help them continue their mission to make lives better for so many people.

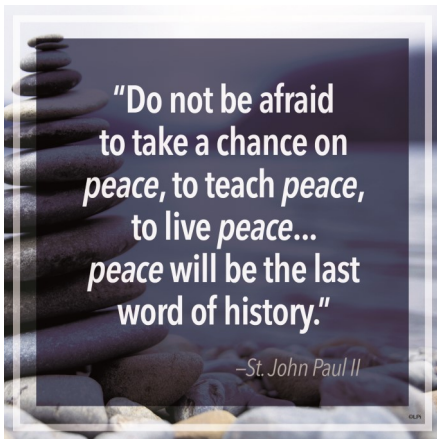

**Hospice Volunteer Opportunities**

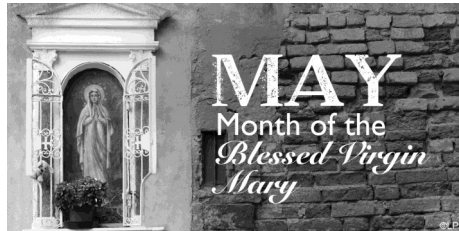
